The Regina Apartments, a brick building designed by Joseph Tognoni for Jean Sigg, a Swiss-born chef at a number of Reno restaurants and casinos is named for his daughter, Regina.

The 1941 building stood next to a private home and downhill from George Wingfield's house.

The exterior has a front entry tower with glossy tile trim and large windows built in

fine brickwork by contractor George Panicari.

The units face Wingfield Park and the river, within walking distance of downtown.

It houses eight 3-room units, which were decorated, two in Satinwood, two in Mahogany Regency, two in Swedish Modern and two in French Provincial.

The upstairs unit has a den with windows on three sides, in the upper tower.
